MPUSD bond issue. (Marta)

- MPUSD pursuing a housing bond to fund facilities to potentially include workforce housing
- Elements needed to build housing, land, water and financing
 - o Plans for Monte Vista School?
 - Water in Marina
- Financing
 - Facilities bond increase in property taxes
 - Property owners would pay for construction fees for bond, as well as interest but MPUSD could use rental fees
 - Survey results from MPUSD documents
 - Parcel tax, in perpetuity, it would have to be voted off to have tax removed from our property taxes
 - o Public Private Partnerships, joint ventures, lease back
 - o Certificate of Participation, MPUSD getting a loan
 - Sale of unused district property

- Board would need to vote to place on the ballot by December 2023
 - o If MVNA wants to stop this bond we need to move quickly
- The amount of interest the public pays is more than double the amount of the bond
- 55% for bond passage under Proposition 39
- Bond written to get emotional response from voters
- Susan asked for MPUSD bond capacity previously and the assessors office informed her that MPUSD had never sought that information
- In 2020 3 of 7 board members voted against the housing bond
- City's report of housing includes housing on school district grounds
- Taxpayers Association will likely come out against this bond measure
- Letter with information to share with other neighborhoods
- Housing could be rented at fair market value if no teachers/staff wanted to rent
- District could possibly sell property to individual teacher homeowners
- Assessors' office should be pro-active in responding to bond capacity
- Money from rent can go towards administrators' salaries
- Marta & Susan will work on a fact sheet to share with other Neighborhood Associations
